Top doc jets to **US for training**

TOWNSVILLE Hospital's Dr Kurinji Kannan is one of just 70 health educators in the world being offered a spot in a prestigious training program at the US Ivy League institution Harvard Universitv.

A urogynaecology staff specialist, Dr Kannan travelled to Boston in January and jet-sets to Harvard University for the second time on Saturday, to finish the course.

"The program is offered to a chosen group of doctors who are also educators and looks at developing the leadership skills needed not only to be good clinicians but also to be good teachers," she said.
